# Bath Quays: The Glass

Lorraine Mephram

The glass assemblage, which amounts to 335 pieces from the excavation, includes vessel and window glass, and a small number of objects. All glass is of post-medieval/modern date. The glass has been quantified by type (e.g. bottle, phial, window glass, etc.), and **Table 1** presents the totals by type. A full list of glass by context is given in Appendix 1.

## *Vessel Glass*

The vessel glass is dominated by containers in the form of wine and other beverage bottles, and of these, hand-blown green wine bottles dating between *c.* 1630 and *c.* 1830 are by far the most common. These fall into a three-fold division of ‘onion’ (*c.* 1680–1730), ‘mallet’ (*c.* 1725–60) and ‘cylindrical’, including ‘squat cylindrical’ (*c.* 1735–1830); terminology and dating follows Dumbrell (1983). While there are a number of fragments that could not be ascribed to specific bottle type, no diagnostic examples of the ‘shaft-and-globe’ form (*c.* 1630–80) were identified, and it seems reasonably safe to assume that the wine bottle glass probably dates no earlier than *c.* 1680. There is one example of an octagonal wine bottle (*ibid.*, ch. 10).

Later wine bottles are represented by machine-made examples in green glass, also including clear glass bottles with the flat band-like collar around the rim typical of French wine bottles of the 19th century and later (Dumbrell 1983, 134). Also present are other types

of mould-blown and machine-made beverage bottles (for beer, mineral waters and other soft drinks). These include Hamilton (torpedo) bottles, bottles with Codd closures as well as later cylindrical bottles with 'blob-top' rims for cork closures, and beaded rims for crown closures. A few bottles carry proprietary marks, mostly of local manufacturers: The Bath Brewery, J B Bowler, Brooke & Co., Hughes & Co., Ross's of Belfast, Sainsbury Brothers and Schweppes. Apart from Ross's and Schweppes, all these are Bath-based companies. A substantial group of these later bottles, probably dating to the late 19th or early 20th century, were taken as a sample from an early 20th-century dump layer (1406) in the corner of Building 34 (New Quay); this included 14 small beverage bottles (one with the Bath Brewery's mark), two wine bottles of French style and two Codd bottles (one with J B Bowler's mark).

Other bottles and jars are largely machine-made examples of later 19th- or 20th-century date, for foodstuffs (e.g. sauces, meat/fish paste), pharmaceuticals and household goods. Two ribbed bottles (one green and one blue) are embossed 'Not to be taken'; another bottle carries the mark of Steele and Marsh of Bath, with 'tablespoon' gradations down the side. Another ribbed bottle held MIL-SAN, presumably a household cleaner or similar. The ribbed bottles, and five complete jars, came from dump layer 1406 alongside the bottles.

Three bottles, however, are earlier; all are hand-blown. Two are represented by wide-mouthed necks with string rims; the bodies were probably octagonal, and these wide-mouthed vessels, although similar in manufacture to wine bottles of the period, are dated to the mid-18th century and are thought to have been intended for use as preserve bottles (Dumbrell 1983, 146–7, pl. 55 and fig. 226). The third bottle (ON 43, from make-up layer 1848) is a small octagonal form, of which only the lower half survives; on one side is an applied bottle seal with the mark of Md. Rosalie Bode, Bath. Madame Bode was a well-known figure in Bath; she was born in 1772 in 'foreign parts', according to the 1841 census; there are references to her working as a milliner, between 1815 and 1842, variously in Gay Street, Wood Street and Pulteney Bridge (Mangin 1815; Gye's Bath Directory of 1819, Hunt's Directory of 1824, Pigot's Directories of 1822, 1830 and 1842); she died in 1844. The bottle presumably held some kind of beauty product.

### *Phials and other vessels*

Eighteen phials were identified from the excavation assemblage, of which seven are complete. All are of cylindrical form, although varying in proportions (some are shorter and squatter than others), size and colour (both greenish and colourless glass was used). The type appeared in the second half of the 17th century, and became predominant in the 18th century,

continuing in use into the 19th century. The variation in size, shape and colour seen here seems to follow a chronological sequence spanning this period: cylindrical phials generally became longer and slimmer through time (17th- and 18th-century examples tend to be shorter and wider), while the basal kick became shallower through the 18th century. Earlier phials were made in greenish or aquamarine glass, with colourless glass used from the mid-18th century (Castillo Cardenas 2014, 314).

Drinking vessels are very poorly represented here; there are just two examples of wine glasses, both of 19th- or 20th-century date, although a few miscellaneous small fragments of thin-walled glass could belong either to drinking vessels or to phials. One cylindrical cut-glass vessel (possibly a vase) was also recovered.

#### *Window glass*

The window glass is not susceptible to close dating, but the presence of a high proportion of fragments in greenish or blue-greenish glass suggests a date for most pre-dating the 19th century; there are some definite fragments of crown glass, and a few flame-rounded edges. The only complete quarry is a small rectangular one in a later, clear glass.

#### *Objects*

Apart from the ubiquitous glass marbles (three, all probably Codd bottle closures), there are three other objects: a button in dark green/black glass; a small biconical cut-glass object with wire attachments on each side, possibly a chandelier glass; and a small globular object with a rear loop attachment, in clear glass with a dark blue 'pupil', possibly a toy's eye.
